

# Milestones

**250 games – Peter Plummer**, “Plum” began his football career at Blackburn in 1983 having been recruited from VFA side Waverley FC. Peter was a rugged defender and played most of his senior career at the Club as a full back. In the latter years he has been a Reserves player who has shown that he still has plenty to offer football. He moved up the ground to full forward and became a major goal kicker for the side. He has always enjoyed flying over the pack to take his customary ‘speccies’ and is still doing so. Peter has been actively involved in both the playing and committee aspects of the Club throughout his career. His career highlights are Seniors Most Determined 1986, Reserves Premierships 1995 & 1996, Co-Captain Reserves 1997, Reserves Runner Up Best & Fairest 1997. Peter served as a Vice-President of the Club and has assisted in the social side of the Club for many years. Peter was awarded Life Membership of the Club in 1992 and is a most admired and respected player. Plum played his 250th on Reserves Grand Final day and even thought the boys lost it is probably a fitting farewell game to go out on. **250 games – Terry Morris**, “TM” began his football career at Blackburn in 1975 running around with the Under 15’s. A local lad, who joined the Club with his mates from school, was a constant trier. Terry was a regular senior player and played his first senior game at the age of seventeen in 1978. Terry was involved in the social committee in 1980 and progressed to the general committee afterwards. He was awarded the Best Clubman Trophy in 1982. Terry was the Club’s Treasurer in 1981 and has been on the committee all but two years of his time at the Club. He is currently the Secretary having filled most positions on the general committee. During his football career he has won several awards, these being Seniors Most Improved 1982 & 1991; Reserves Best & Fairest 1993; BFC Life Membership 1993; Reserves Premiership Team 1996; Reserves Most Consistent 1997, Reserves Runner Up Best & Fairest 1998. Terry did not play at the Club between 1983 and 1988 transferring to EDFL club Nunawading. He reached this major milestone in round 17 against Lilydale. TM received his EDFL 300 Game Life Membership in 1996. He has played almost every position on the paddock over the years and his favoured position is on the half-back line. Terry is now 37 and the injuries are harder to shake off these days, however he still loves his footy and enjoys playing the game with his old mates. A serious knee injury in the Reserves Grand Final could spell the end of his long-playing career.

**50 games – Robert Costelloe**, “Rusty” began his career at Blackburn in 1995 transferring from South Croydon FC. He has established himself as a senior player and will be a great player for the Club in the future. Injuries have upset his consistency over the years and hopefully these have passed. Robbie is a talented player who is a good mover for his size and always hard at the ball. He is able to play most positions on the ground and excels when given the opportunity to run freely. Robbie played his 50<sup>th</sup> on the 30<sup>th</sup> August during the Reserves First Semi Final.

**50 games – Lachlan Head**, Lachie began his career at Blackburn in 1995 and has a fair amount of ability. He is a left footer who runs with the ball and has a great pair of hands for his height. He has good balance and will become a regular senior player in the years to come. Lachie reached his 50<sup>th</sup> on the 30<sup>th</sup> August. He is able to play most flank and pocket positions and excels running off the half back or centre lines.
